ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT



Jonathan Larson

Jonathan Larson received the 1996 Pulitzer Prize for Drama for RENT. He also won the 1996 Tony Award for Best Musical and the 1994 Richard Rodgers Award for RENT and twice received The Gilman Gonzales-Falla Theatre Foundation's Commendation Award. In 1989 he was granted

the Stephen Sondheim Award from American Music Theatre Festival, where he contributed to the musical Sitting on the Edge of the Future. In 1988 he won the Richard Rodgers Development Grant for his rock musical Superbia, which was staged at Playwrights Horizon. He composed the score for the musical, J.P. Morgan Saves

the Nation, which was presented by En Garde Arts in 1995. Mr. Larson performed his rock monologue tick, tick... BOOM! at Second Stage Theatre, The Village Gate and New York Theatre Workshop. In addition to scoring and song writing for Sesame Street, he created music for a number for children's book-cassettes, including Steven Spielberg's An American Tail and Land Before Time. Other film scores include work for Rolling Stones magazine publisher Jann Wenner. He conceived, directed and wrote four original songs for Away We Go!, a musical video for children. RENT, his rock opera based on La Boheme, had its world premiere on February 13, 1996 at New York Theatre Workshop. Mr. Larson died unexpectedly of an aortic aneurysm on January 25, 1996, ten days before his 36th birthday. His music (including songs cut from his shows) is archived in the Library of Congress.

Music Theatre International (MTI) is one of the world's leading theatrical licensing agencies, granting theatres from around the world the rights to perform the greatest selection of musicals from Broadway and beyond. Founded in 1952 by composer Frank Loesser and orchestrator Don Walker, MTI is a driving force in advancing musical theatre as a vibrant and engaging art form.

MTI works directly with the composers, lyricists and book writers of these musicals to provide official scripts, musical materials and dynamic theatrical resources to over 100,000 professional, community and school theatres in the US and in over 150 countries worldwide.

MTI is particularly dedicated to educational theatre, and has created special collections to meet the needs of various types of performers and audiences. MTI's Broadway Junior® shows are 30- and 60-minute musicals for performance by elementary and middle school-aged performers, while MTI's School Editions are musicals annotated for performance by high school students.

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Rent is loosely based on the opera La Bohème

Giacomo Puccini's *La Bohème* tells the story of a group of young, struggling artists in Paris living "the bohemian life". One of the most frequently performed operas ever written, within a few years of *La Bohème's* 1896 world premier in Turin, Italy, it had taken Europe, Britain and America by storm.

Rent opened off-Broadway almost exactly 100 years after La Bohème's premier; just one of many ways in which the two productions are intentionally connected. "I analyzed the libretto, broke it down beat by beat," Larson told The New York Times. Both shows document the life of a group of artists struggling with poverty and disease (tuberculosis in La Bohème and HIV/AIDS in Rent); still, the characters are all able to find happiness through love, friendship, and the act of creation. Here are more parallels between the productions:

Candlelight and love at first sight:

In La Bohème, Rodolfo and Mimì meet when she knocks on his door to ask him to light her candle. The pair are immediately infatuated with one another, and when Mimì realizes she dropped her key, Rodolfo finds it and hides it from her so they can spend more time together. In Rent, this meet-cute is replicated almost exactly during the song "Light My Candle," except instead of her key, Mimi is a drug addict and drops her stash. The song ends with the line "They call me Mimi," another direct reference to La Bohème and Mimì's song "Sì, mi chiamano Mimì"—"Yes, they call me Mimì."

Rodolfo/Roger Davis:

Changed from a poet to a musician/songwriter, he is a romantic at heart. At the beginning of both shows, he is deeply lonely, and only cheers up after meeting Mimi.

Marcello/Mark Cohen:

In *La Bohème*, Marcello spends the show pining after Musetta. But in *Rent*, Mark focuses all of his energy on his documentary.

Mimì/Mimi Márquez:

This character is a seamstress in the opera and a dancer in the musical, but in both productions, she and Rodolfo/Roger fall in love at first sight, marking the beginning of a tumultuous relationship.

Musetta/Maureen Johnson:

So fiery that she earns her own dance ("Musetta's Waltz" and "Tango: Maureen"), this character is a source of drama in both productions. In *La Bohème*, she leaves Marcello for the rich and elderly Alcindoro. In *Rent*, she leaves Mark for Joanne.

Benoit/Benjamin Coffin III:

Rodolfo/Roger and Marcello/Mark's landlord in both productions. In *Rent*, he is their former roommate, enjoying newfound wealth thanks to his recent marriage.

Colline/Tom Collins

and Schaunard/Angel Dumott Schunard:

Relatively minor characters in La Bohème, but Rent gives them a storyline of their own. Transformed from philosopher and musician to philosophy professor and percussionist/drag queen, respectively, Collins and Angel meet by chance at the beginning of the musical.

Candace James (she/her) - Intimacy Consultant




Featured Artist **DAISY CURLEY**

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
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


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
