## Madcap hijinks are de rigueur in Ken Ludwig's Baskerville

**Olympia, WA** – January 9, 2023 – Harlequin Productions presents *Ken Ludwig's Baskerville: A Sherlock Holmes Mystery* by Ken Ludwig, January 27 – February 11, 2023 at the State Theater in downtown Olympia, WA. Corey McDaniel will direct.

Get your deerstalker cap on — the play's afoot! Ken Ludwig's Baskerville: A Sherlock Holmes Mystery transforms Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's classic "The Hound of the Baskervilles" into a murderously funny adventure. The male heirs of the Baskerville line are being dispatched one by one, and Sherlock Holmes is on the case. To find their ingenious killer, Holmes and Watson must brave the desolate moors before a family curse dooms its newest heir. Watch as our intrepid investigators try to escape a dizzying web of clues, silly accents, disguises, and deceit as five actors deftly portray more than forty characters. Does a wild hellhound prowl the moors of Devonshire? Can our heroes discover the truth in time? Join the fun and see how far from elementary the truth can be.

Why this production? Says Director Corey McDaniel, "I believe that Harlequin has chosen to kick off the 2023 season with this piece because we want to launch the year with a true crowd-pleaser and lots of joy and laughter. This selection allows us to introduce a year of pure entertainment. The 2023 season holds the most musicals and comedies ever produced in a single year by Harlequin and *Baskerville* represents what audiences have been asking for as we all attempt to relieve ourselves of the stress and anxieties of the past several years."

Of the five actors playing a total of 37 roles in this high-energy romp, only one is a Harlequin newcomer: Russell Matthews, who plays Sherlock Holmes. Of the production, he says, "Baskerville is a fantastic marrying of comedy and mystery. You're taking everything you love about your favorite Sherlock Holmes story, 'The Hound of the Baskervilles', and you're putting in a madcap comic energy with a lot of gags, a lot of fun. We're taking the material seriously, but not *too* seriously, so we've got something in there for everybody."

What excites him about tackling this piece and what does he think audiences will respond to the most? McDaniel says, "This play is just PURE FUN! Aside from having

37 characters, it also has 30 brief and fast-moving scenes. I think that audiences are going to love the actors' choices about all their characters. All the characters are turning out to be fully realized individuals with histories and rich personalities, with quirks, flaws, and relatable humanity. I also anticipate that audiences are going to love the atmosphere of the design elements which will take us to that eerie, shadowy darkness of a true murder mystery."

#### **SELECT BIOS:**

Corey McDaniel (Director) returns to Harlequin after recently appearing as Christmas Present in A Christmas Carol. His directorial work has been seen on the Harlequin stage with Murder for Two in 2022, Tenderly, The Rosemary Clooney Musical in 2021, Noises Off in 2020 and I Ought to be in Pictures in 2019, and he was seen on-stage in Harlequin's production of the one-man show I Am My Own Wife in 2018. Corey was the founder and producing artistic director of Seattle's Theatre22 during their ten years. As an actor, he has worked throughout the US and internationally and his performance credits have placed him in such reputable arenas as the Fox Theatres, the Hollywood Bowl, Theatro Sistina in Rome, and the Metropolitan Opera House of NYC. Some of Corey's more recent director credits include Nonsense and Beauty, White, Burn This, The Pride, Wizzer Pizzer, and The Hours of Life for Theatre22, The Merry Wives of Windsor with Wooden O/Seattle Shakespeare Company, Treasure Island with Book-It Repertory Theatre, Sister Act the Musical, Bonnie and Clyde, and Good Kids at Cornish College of the Arts, Julius Caesar with Island Shakespeare Festival and The Wild Party for Sound Theatre Company (Gregory Award for Best Musical).

Russell Matthews (Sherlock Holmes) was last seen in Theatre22's production of Nonsense and Beauty as Bob Buckingham. Other recent roles include SecondStory Rep's production of St. Joan as King Charles VII, Dan in Next to Normal with Twelfth Night Productions, Cassio in Fern Shakespeare's Othello, and various roles in Richard II with GreenStage. Russell has performed on the East Coast at The Lost Colony, The Candlelight Theatre, and with the Nebraska Theater Caravan on seven national tours of A Christmas Carol. Recently Russell voiced multiple characters over two seasons on the podcast The Horned Moon Presents. Russell currently lives in Lake Tapps with an adorable newborn and beloved spouse.
